

This question was later posed to our membership at the 2021 Annual General Meeting. We acknowledged that often there is debate between "pro-life" groups who target different audiences and then choose different methods to promote their cause. These debates cause dissension among the groups and leads to a lack of cooperation. We resolved to take a holistic approach that presumes most people are "pro-life" and our goal now, is to recognize them through their pro-life witness in their everyday activities.

While pursuing the thought-provoking statement *I am pro-life when...*, we decided to make banners that display a variety of postures that model "pro-life" behavior. Banner Project • Sharing Pro-Life through Visuals

Calgary Pro-Life Association recently participated in a gathering with our Indigenous friends. With the expectation of future invitations, we decided to commission a painting depicting Our Lady of Guadalupe meeting with St. Juan Diego, an Indigenous man, as part of our Banner Project. The image on the front page was created by Ms. Elizabeth Blair, a local artist.

Calgary Pro-Life believes there is a profound respect for life message that is subtly revealed in this rendition of the apparition of Our Lady of Guadalupe. We ask you to ponder in your heart what that message is to you as you review some of the history of this event.

As children, some of us remember learning a song that began, "In 1492, Columbus sailed the ocean blue..." that helped us learn the history of the evangelization of the New World to the Christian faith. For approximately 40 years, evangelization was progressing very slowly among the Indigenous

Aztec people of Mexico. Then, in December of 1531, Juan Diego, a recent convert to Catholicism, witnessed an apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Mary appeared to him several times, culminating in an encounter where she asked him to collect some flowers from the top of Tepeyak Hill, near current day Mexico City. Although it was not the season for flowers, Juan heeded Our Lady's request and collected the miraculous Castilian roses that are native to Spain (not Mexico) thus linking her also to the Spanish missionaries ministering to the Aztecs at that time.

When Juan Diego presented the roses to the local religious authorities, Our Lady left her miraculous image on his cactus fiber tilma. The image remains to this day. We present a key Marian message on "our" depiction of Our Lady of Guadalupe that says, "Let not your heart be disturbed... Am I not here, who am your Mother? Are you not under my protection?" We think this message is appropriate for all peoples, of all ages,

especially those living in our times. Perhaps you can see your tear-filled eyes looking at Our Lady.

Considerable discussion and debate accompany this miraculous image. Here, we present only a few facts: More than eight million Aztec Mexicans embraced the Christian faith in the 10 years after its appearance. The image remains with us almost 500 years later despite being "painted" upon a biodegradable cactus fiber. Our Lady, who is with child and is "cloaked with the sun," continues to leave an indelible mark upon those who encounter her.

We added an eagle to the image to represent the dignity of Juan Diego whose Indigenous name means *Talking Eagle*, and to capture the religious significance of the eagle to Indigenous people.

Like Our Lady, let each of us become intercessors so that we may bring others closer to God by attracting them to the beauty of the Christian faith.

The seven *Corporal Works of Mercy* are given to us by Jesus as a model of how we are to treat each other. (Matthew 25:31-46) When we follow these teachings, we are being charitable. We show respect for life when we provide for the physical needs of our neighbour(s).

Through our mission to promote the dignity and sanctity of human life, we at Calgary Pro-life Association have been stirred to create visual images that will move you to consider how you are responding to the needs of humanity.

A banner is being created where each of the corporal works of mercy will be depicted. The purpose is to motivate each of us to live out these works in our daily lives.

The seven *Corporal Works of Mercy* are to: Feed the hungry; Give drink to the thirsty; Shelter the homeless; Visit the sick; Visit the prisoners; Bury the dead; and Give alms to the poor.

There are many people who go without food everyday, even in our own neighbourhoods. We are called to do something to help alleviate their hunger. When my husband and I assemble a food hamper for St. Vincent de Paul and deliver it to a client/family in need – and when we collect a donation from Cobs Bread for hamper basket additions, these are a couple of ways that we are living our pro-life mission to feed the hungry.

Sometimes, when I go to the grocery store, I might see that someone is sitting on the ground outside with a placard asking for help. I take time to buy a sandwich and give it to the individual on my way out. This is just another example of how we can give to those who are hungry.

As a prelude to the *Corporal Works of Mercy* banner being completed, and for our next newsletter, we invite you to send in a story sharing an example of corporal works of mercy as seen or demonstrated in your daily life. You will notice that your charitable action is indeed pro-life.
